
IV POLICY BASED ROUTING

Jeff Logan informed the LRPC that Mark Chase, a 9-1-1 Advisory Board member, will discuss regionalization and consolidation at the 9-1-1 Advisory Board meeting on November 20, 2024. After Chase's presentation, the LRPC should have a better understanding of what action to take.
