Subject: ANNUAL TRAINING ALLOTMENT AUTHORIZATION

The California 9-1-1 Emergency Communications Branch (CA 9-1-1 Branch) approves a one-time increase in 9-1-1 County Coordinator and Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) Annual Training Allotment (ATA) for State Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025. All ATA allotments will be increased by an additional 50% over what is currently allowed. This one-time increase is intended to encourage PSAPs to send more personnel to the many conferences and training opportunities that will be happening within California this year. Please see the table below for the new funding amounts. If you have questions about your allotment amount, please contact your 9-1-1 Advisor for assistance. 9-1-1 County Coordinators and PSAPs are responsible for monitoring and tracking their ATA. Training reimbursement cannot exceed the allotment amount for FY 2024-2025.
